# Uku Walking Tour Map

Uku is the northernmost island of the Goto Islands. The richly colored statues of Ebisu, the deity of fishery, which can be seen here and there indicate the deep relationship between Uku island and the sea. Surrounded by rich nature and decorated with the history of defeated warriors of the Heike clan, Uku is a treasure island filled with islanders' warm hearts.



## Ukujima Museum

The museum has a variety of historical and cultural materials unearthed in Ukujima. Swords, celadon, white porcelain ware, and other precious materials are on display. Reservations are needed.

## Statues of Taira No Iemori & Fujiwara Hisamichi

General Taira No Iemori and his subordinate Fujiwara Hisamichi landed the island in 1187 after the defeat in the Genpei War. Taira No Iemori became the ruler of Uku island and his family, 7 generations, governed the island for about 200 years.

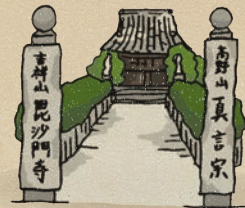

## Bishamon-ji Temple

Founded in 1188 as the Uku family's private temple for praying. The enshrined statues in the temple are Bishamonten Heaven King, the great priest Kobo Daishi, and so on.

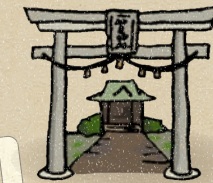


## Toko-ji Temple

The Uku family's family temple. Built in 1187 by the family founder Taira No Iemori, the temple has the graves of the founder and the 6 generation heads.

## Kojima Shrine

This old shrine was founded by Taira No Iemori, the ruler of Uku island, in 1187 and its Torii gate erected in 1921 is very famous.

## Matsubara Ruins

The prehistoric ruins discovered in 1872 within the precincts of Kojima Shrine. 8 Korean-style dolmens were unearthed.

## Whale Ebisu

A simple and richly-colored Ebisu deity statue made in the Edo period (1603 - 1868) hoping for a good catch of whales and fishermen's safety.



## Hamagata Fureai Museum

An experience-based learning facility featuring the history of the island and Amanshi divers for abalones, the culture of the whale hunting, the company history of former Miyazaki canning factory, and so on.
